BEQUESTS

What is a bequest? A bequest is simply a gift that is included in a person's Will. Most people want to ensure that their family and friends are provided for in the event of their death. A bequest does not have to be monetary. It can take the form of property, an insurance policy, shares or even a certain percentage of your estate. It can either be in the form of an outright bequest, or in a trust, with a charity such as the Children's Hospital Trust as a beneficiary. Alternatively you could allocate the residue of your estate, which is whatever remains after you have made provision for your loved ones.

Why leave a bequest to charity?

Charitable bequests have been included in Wills for centuries. They are a way of keeping your ideals and your compassion alive for years and even generations to come. A charitable bequest offers you the opportunity to make a really worthwhile gift to a cause dear to your heart, to perpetuate your name or that of a loved one. They help to make the world a better place and touch the lives of those in need. A bequest means that you are able to leave your own legacy that lives on years after you have passed on. Charitable bequests may also save on Estate Duty

Can you change an existing Will to include a bequest to charity?

Adding what is called a codicil to change an existing Will is a simple matter. It is, however, not advisable to alter your Will yourself as you may invalidate the entire document.
